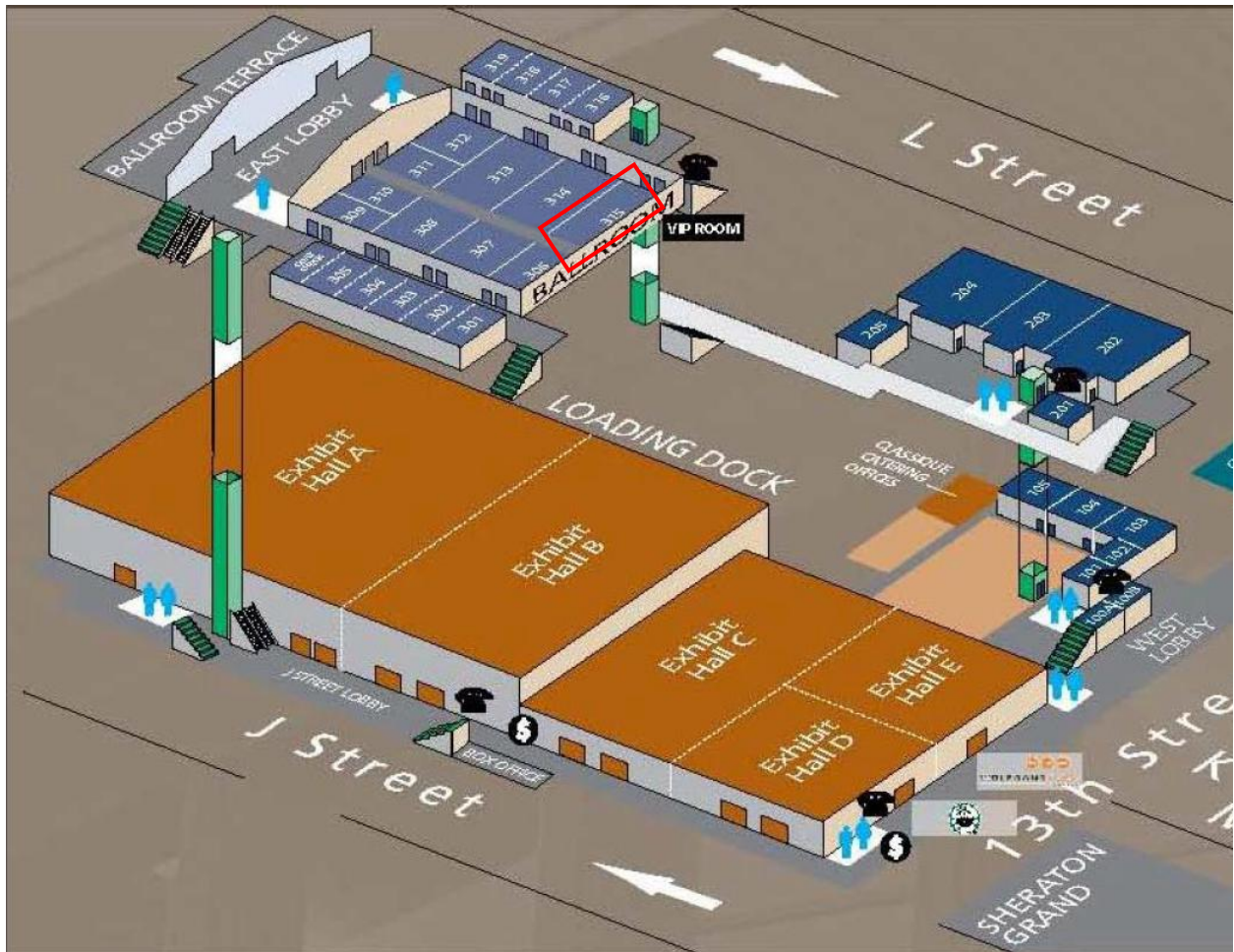


Figure 1 - Location of RM 315
